v. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

The Word of God the Father,

begotten before the ages,

in the latter times willed to be incarnate of the Virgin

and endured crucifixion unto death.

He has saved mortal man//

by His Resurrection.

v. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We glorify You, O Lord

for You voluntarily endured the Cross for our sake.

We fall down in worship before You, almighty Savior.

Do not cast us away from Your face,

but hear us and save us, Lover of man//

v. (5) For Your name's sake I have waited for You, O Lord, my soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Glory to You, O Savior Christ,
only begotten Son of God, Who were nailed to the Cross//
and resurrected from the tomb on the third day!

*v. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch
let Israel hope on the Lord.*

We glorify Your Resurrection from the dead, O Christ,
by which You have freed Adam's race from the tortures of Hades,//
and as God have granted to the world eternal life and great mercy.

*v. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous
redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Lord endures for ever.*

All-blessed martyr Callinicus,
you obtained the unseen Lord as an invincible ally against unseen
enemies.
You raised up great trophies of immortality.
By the mighty blows of your contest
you overthrew him who boasts that he would blot out the earth and the
sea,//
drowning him in the streams of your blood.
