Reader: (Reads text from service book)

v. (10) *Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!*

Come, let us worship the Word of God

begotten of the Father before all ages,

and incarnate of the Virgin Mary!

Having endured the Cross, He was buried as He himself desired.//

And having risen from the dead, He saved me, the erring one.

v. (9) *The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.*

Christ our Savior nailed to the Cross the bond against us,

He voided it and destroyed the dominion of death.//

We fall down before His Resurrection on the third day.

v. (8) *Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!*

With the Archangels let us praise the Resurrection of Christ!

He is our Savior, our Redeemer.

He is coming with awesome glory and mighty power//

to judge the world which He made.

v. (7) *Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!*

The Angel proclaimed You as the crucified and buried Master.

He told the women: "Come, see the place where He lay!

He is risen as He said, for He is almighty."

We worship You, only immortal One.//

O Christ, the Giver of life, have mercy on us!

v. (6) *In the Second Tone, If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.*

By Your Cross, You destroyed the curse of the tree.

By Your burial You destroyed the dominion of death.

By Your rising, You enlightened the human race.//

O Benefactor, Christ our God, glory to You!

v. (5) *For Your name's sake I have waited for You, O Lord, my soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.*

The gates of death opened to You from fear, O Lord.

When the guards of hell saw You they were afraid,

for You demolished the gates of brass and smashed the iron chains.//

You have led us from the darkness and the shadows of death, and have
broken our bonds.

*v. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let
Israel hope on the Lord!*

Let us come and worship in the house of the Lord,
singing the hymn of salvation:

“Cleanse our sins, for You were crucified and raised from the dead, //
and are in the bosom of the Father!”

*v. (3) In the Fourth Tone, For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is
plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

O blessed Martyr Julian,
we celebrate your divine and light-bearing memorial.

We know you as a radiant sun,
shining on the whole world with the brilliance of your mind;
casting out the night of disbelief in the true God!//

As we venerate your relics, we gain strength of soul.

*v. (2) In the Sixth Tone, Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all
peoples!*

You were lashed with a whip, O blessed one,
kicked frightfully and confined in prison.

While in affliction, you transcended your surroundings:

You were encompassed by wild beasts;

you entered into the deep and were drowned by the sea.

You received your holy end without denying the Master of all.//

You are greatly blessed, the glory of the martyrs.

*v. (1) For His mercy is abundant towards us; and the truth of the Lord
endures forever.*

Your most holy and beloved mother
saw you drift from the waves of the sea to dry land
by the direction of the Spirit.

She faithfully welcomed you, O Martyr Julian.

She committed your blameless and sorely-tried body to burial://
the body victorious through grace over the tyranny of the Devil

In the Sixth Tone, Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Having drawn the inexhaustible drink of the pure Faith, O blessed one,
you extinguished the worship of idols,

and came triumphantly to the contest,

bright with dew like an never-waning star,

illuminated by Christ, the Sun Who shines forever.

And having seen every city,

you received the blessed end of a martyr's death by being cast into the sea,

And, wearing your crown, you came into the presence of Christ.
Beseech Him, O most glorious Julian,//
that He save those who celebrate your memory with faith!

In the Second Tone, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Aposticha – Tone 2

By Your burial You mortified the majesty of death.

v. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

O Christ, when You were seen nailed to the Cross,
You restored the beauty of Your creatures.
The soldiers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Your side with a
spear.
The Hebrews not knowing Your power asked that Your tomb might be
sealed,
but through the mercy of Your compassion,
You accepted the tomb and rose on the third day!//
O Lord, glory to You!

v. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O Christ, the Giver of life,
for the sake of the dead You voluntarily endured death,
descending into hell as the Mighty One
to save those who awaited Your coming,
granting them the life of paradise instead of hell.
Grant also to us who glorify Your Resurrection on the third day//
cleansing of our sins and great mercy!

In the Sixth Tone, Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Come, O lovers of the martyrs,
let us reverently venerate the glorious Julian,
the sufferer for Christ and fellow citizen of Paul,
who appeared as a traveler and finished the same course.
For, thrown into the water with sea monsters and poisonous snakes,
he sanctified both the earth, with his blood, and the sea, by his passage.
Having departed from things here to the eternal dwelling,
he received the prize of his struggles from the right hand of the Almighty, //
and asks for our souls purification and great mercy.
