Reader: (Reads text from service book)

v. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!

By Your Cross, O Christ our Savior,

death's dominion has been shattered;

the devil's delusion destroyed.

The human race, being saved by faith,//

always offers You a song.

v. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Your Resurrection, O Lord.

Paradise has been opened again.

All creation, praising You,//

always offers You a song.

v. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the Father and the Son.

I praise the authority of the Holy Spirit:

the undivided, uncreated Godhead,//

the consubstantial Trinity which reigns forever.

v. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

We bow down in worship before Your precious Cross, O Christ,

and we glorify and praise Your Resurrection,//

for by Your wounds we have all been healed.

v. (6) In the Second Tone, If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We praise the Savior incarnate of the Virgin,

for He was crucified for our sake and resurrected on the third day,//

granting us great mercy.

v. (5) For Your name's sake I have waited for You, O Lord, my soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Christ descended to hell proclaiming the glad tidings:

“Be bold! Now I have triumphed!

I am the Resurrection, I will lead you out,//

for I have shattered the gates of death!”

v. (4) In the Fourth Tone, From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

and with him the magnificent John,

the two martyrs who possessed the radiance of the Trinity,
the foundation of the Faith!

They are flowers sending forth the true fragrance of the understanding of
Christ, //

who always pray to the Lord for us.

v. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

v. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You were radiant with fasting and the glory of life,

and later you adorned your souls with suffering, O glorious Cyrus.

In wisdom, O John, you forsook an earthly army

and found the army of heaven.

As you entreat the Savior, O blessed ones, //

pray for those who bless your memory!

v. (1) For His mercy is abundant towards us; and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O blessed ones, you were revealed as physicians of the sick,

and never-fading lamps of the divine Father.

You uttered your confession together and shared in the lot of martyrs.

Having truly received crowns from Christ, O glorious Cyrus and wise

John, //

ever pray to the Savior for those who hymn you with faith!

In the Eighth Tone, Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Two martyrs are revealed to us today,

healing the pain of our souls:

Cyrus and John, the two wonder-workers.

The one, embracing the angelic life and persevering to the end,

united himself to Christ by the blood of martyrdom,

while the other, brilliant in the ranks of the army,

is now enrolled in the armies of heaven.

Therefore, they grant healing to those who celebrate their memory in faith, //
ever praying for our souls.

In the Third Tone, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

at your mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother?

For without receiving the touch of man,

you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, immaculate Virgin.

The Son born of the Father before eternity

was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored Lady.
