Behold Emmanuel has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross!

Granting life, He has slain death.//

v. (6) In the Eighth Tone, If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

O Venerable Father Job!

You loved Christ from infancy,

At the age of ten, you turned away from the loving eyes of your <u>par</u>ents, and went to dwell in the Ugórnitsky Monastery of the radiant

Transfigu<u>ra</u>tion of our Lord,

the honor of the call from the Most High, and the future heavenly city.
