Reader: (Reads text from service book) v. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name! By Your precious Cross, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>only begot</u>ten One.

v. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaugh</u>ter in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. The <u>princes of Hades were fright</u>ened by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lift</u>ed. Christ the King of glory had <u>en</u>tered, <u>saying to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "<u>Come</u> to the light!"</u>

v. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

<u>Oh</u>, great <u>won</u>der!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His love for man and rose again immortal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

Delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one God in three Persons!

v. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

We offer You our evening worship,

O never setting Light,

Who came in these last days to the world in the flesh;

Who even descended to Hades to dispel its darkness.

And Who have revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>nations.//</u>

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

v. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We <u>glo</u>rify the Leader of our sal<u>va</u>tion; by His Resurrection <u>from</u> the dead, the <u>world</u> was <u>saved</u> from deceit. The as<u>sem</u>bly of Angels rejoices as the deceit of demons is <u>o</u>verthrown.// Fallen Adam <u>rises</u> as the <u>dev</u>il falls. v. (5) For Your name's sake I have waited for You, O Lord, my soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The guards were instructed by the lawless ones:

"Hide the rising of Christ, take money and say:

'The body was stolen from the tomb while we were asleep."

But who has heard of a body being stolen,

a body embalmed and <u>naked</u>,

with its grave clothes left behind in the tomb?

Do not be deceived, O Jews,

study the words of the Prophets and understand://

Christ is the Redeemer of the world and all powerful!

v. (4) In the Fourth Tone, From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch let Israel hope on the Lord

Most glorious Pro<u>co</u>pius,

your name was given you from heaven as to a preacher to the <u>nations</u>.

Enlightened in mind, you forsook the darkness of idolatry,

becoming a lamp for the faithful,

brightening the ends of the earth with the divine radiance of your <u>struggle</u>,// glory and boast of the <u>martyrs</u>.

v. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

First you subdued the uprisings of the flesh with abstinence;

then you set yourself apart for the contest

with a courageous mind, through the power of the Spirit,

not sparing your flesh, O blessed Procopius.

You endured all manner of tortures,//

ascending with your crown to the choirs on high.

v. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

As an invincible commander <u>armed</u> with the Cross,

you drowned the power of the enemy in the streams of your blood.

You richly poured forth showers of healing, O wondrous one,

from the well-springs of salvation,

watering all who are held fast in the <u>flame</u> of the <u>pas</u>sions,// O divinely in<u>spired</u> one.

v. (1) For His mercy is abundant towards us; and the truth of the Lord endures for ever.

Most glorious Procopius,

like Paul, you were first called from heaven by <u>Je</u>sus, the Truth. Having be<u>lieved</u> in Him, you abandoned the lies and godless de<u>lu</u>sion that had been delivered to you by your <u>an</u>cestors,

and were led away, rejoicing, to painful torments,//

illumined by Christ's example of perfect suffering, O blessed saint.

In the Sixth Tone, Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Greatly-suffering Procopius,

your glorious memorial shines forth today. calling us who love the feasts of the Church to praise and glorify Christ our God, in a fitting manner. Therefore as we hasten to the shrine of your relics we receive gifts of healings, and we ceaselessly sing the praises of Christ the Savior, // Who has crowned you with glory. now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God, Who appeared as Man,// O Lord, have mercy on us! Priest: Wisdom! Let us attend! Choir: O Gladsome Light ... (p.16) Aposticha – Tone 5

We magnify You in songs of praise, O incarnate Christ and Savior. By accepting the Cross and death for our sake, as the Lord and Lover of man, You overthrew the gates of Hades.// and arose on the third day, saving our souls.

v. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By being pierced in the side, O Lover of man, You have poured out drops of life and salvation for all. By accepting death in the flesh, You have granted us immortality. You have freed us by being placed in the tomb, and have resurrected us with Yourself in glory, as God.// Glory to You, O Lord and Lover of man!

v. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Your crucifixion and descent into Hades are awesome, O Lover of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient prisoners. You have opened Paradise and given it to us. Grant us purification of sins. who glorify Your Resurrection on the third day! Make us worthy of Paradise// and save us, O Lover of man! v. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

For our sake, You accepted death in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the third day.

<u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>pas</u>sions, and re<u>store</u> us from our evil trans<u>gres</u>sions;// and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man! *In the Eighth Tone, Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;*Enlightened by the mystical brilliance of the all-radiant <u>Trin</u>ity, courageously minded martyr Pro<u>cop</u>ius, you became a <u>god</u> by a<u>dop</u>tion, <u>de</u>ified by com<u>mun</u>ion.

Therefore, by your prayers save from various mis<u>fortunes</u>// those who celebrate your radiant <u>fes</u>tival with faith!
