
Reader: (Reads text from service book)

in order to grant Resurrection to the human race.


The princes of Hades were frightened by this,


for the gates of sorrow were lifted.

Oh, great wonder!


The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man


and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mor</u>tal. <u>Come</u>, O sons of <u>nations</u>,

But who has heard of a body being stolen,


a body embalmed and naked,

v. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.


The One Whom you denied at His condem<u>na</u>tion, you hymned when He <u>rose</u> from the dead.


You preached Him to the ends of the earth, O Apostle,

Rejoice, O joy of the universe,


keeper of the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven,

here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed.


After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable;





setting before us his precious chains


