Reader: The Reading from the Second Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to Timothy.

Deacon: Let us attend!

Reader: My son Timothy, be sober in all things, endure hardship, do the work of one who proclaims the Good News and fulfill your ministry.

As for me, I am already being offered in sacrifice, and the time of my release has come. I have fought the good fight! I have finished the course! I have kept the faith! From now on, the crown of righteousness is reserved for me, which the Lord – the righteous judge – will give me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all those who have loved his appearing.

Brothers and sisters, be careful not to let anyone rob you through philosophy and vain deceit, according to human tradition and the basic things of the world, and not after Christ. you were also circumcised with a circumcision not made with hands, by casting off the body of the sins of the flesh, in the circumcision of Christ, having been buried with him through baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead.

Priest: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. **Mark**.

Priest: The beginning of the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the prophets:

Behold, I send my messenger before your face,

who will prepare your way before you.

The voice of one crying in the wilderness:

'Make ready the way of the Lord!

Make his paths straight!'

John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching the baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All the country of Judea and those from Jerusalem went out to him. They were all baptized by John in the Jordan river, confessing their sins. John was clothed with camel's hair, and a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He preached, saying, "He who comes after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to kneel down and untie the strap of his sandals. The child was growing, and was becoming strong in spirit, being filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him. His parents went every year to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover.

When Jesus was twelve years old, they went up to Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast. When they had fulfilled the days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. Joseph and his mother did not notice it. Supposing him to be in the company, they went a day's journey and began to look for him among their relatives and acquaintances. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, looking for him. After three days, they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. All who heard him were amazed by his understanding and answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us this way? Behold, your father and I were anxiously looking for you."

He said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. After this, he went down with them, and came to Nazareth. He was obedient to them, and his mother kept all these sayings in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, as well as in favor with God and men.
