v. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!


Possessing victory over Hades, O Christ,

Today Christ tramples on death,


for He is risen as He said!


Let us all sing this song,

In heaven You dwell!


In Hades You trampled on death!


In the depths of the sea?

"O You Who rose from the dead, have mercy on us!"






v. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

dwelling in the midst of wild beasts,


and most strangely ministered to by a bird that served you by the inspiration of God.

you fled the beauties of the world, O Father John,


then, instead of the broader way,

having been pierced with the fervent love of Christ,


Whose unspeakable poverty you came to cherish,


and which you endured while homeless at your parents' gates, O Father,


suffering oppression and humiliation.

and in the heavens you inherited the riches that cannot be taken away.







Take away our wailing and tears!"








v: Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!
