Today let us praise in song





The wise Acindynus





Neither life nor death,


Nor boiling cauldrons nor the depths of the earth,



As you delight in sweetness and are filled with light,





They call us, lovers of piety, saying:


Come, feast as you behold our sufferings:








## **APOSTIKHA - Tone 4**

And have mercy on us!





Rejoice, Elpidephorus!




Blessed is the earth that received your blood, Passion-Bearers of the Lord,
