


v. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.


You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake.

v. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!


When the Apostles beheld the Resurrection of the Maker,

v. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. <u>You</u> were smitten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. <u>You</u> were nailed to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// Almighty Lord and <u>Lov</u>er of man, <u>glo</u>ry to You!



v. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Ful<u>filling</u> the prophecy of <u>Da</u>vid, Christ <u>man</u>ifested His greatness in Zion to the dis<u>ci</u>ples. <u>He</u> is praised and always <u>glo</u>rified, to<u>geth</u>er with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it. At <u>first</u> as the Word, He was <u>bod</u>iless, but <u>then</u> He took flesh and was <u>slain</u> for our sake.// He rose in <u>pow</u>er as the <u>Lov</u>er of man!



v. (5) For Your name's sake I have waited for You, O Lord, my soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You de<u>scend</u>ed into Hades as You <u>willed</u>, O Christ, over<u>throwing</u> death as God, and rising on the third day as <u>Mas</u>ter!

With Your<u>self</u> You raised Adam from the bonds of Hades and from cor<u>rup</u>tion!// Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O only <u>Lov</u>er of man!



v. (4) In the Sixth Tone, From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

trembling at the river of fire flowing past Your throne,


as each one waits to hear the sentence he deserves.

for, worthless as we are, we turn to You in faith,//


O compassionate and merciful Lord!

v. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!


The trumpet shall sound, and the graves shall be opened;

When the <u>thrones</u> are set in place and the books are <u>opened</u>, then God will take His place on the <u>judg</u>ment seat.


Oh, what a fearful sight!








Aposticha – Tone 7


v. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

v. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!


When You were placed in the tomb as one asleep,


the sight was great and awesome.

The time is at <u>hand</u>, O my soul.


Turn to the good and loving <u>Savior!</u>

Beg Him to forgive your malice and weakness, as you cry in faith:



Reader: The Prokeimenon, in the 3rd Tone: Great is our Lord, and abundant in power, His understanding is beyond measure.


Choir: Great is our Lord, and abundant in power, His understanding is beyond measure.






Reader: Praise the Lord! For it is good to sing praises to our God!

Reader: The Reading from the First Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians.

Deacon: Let us attend!

Reader: Brothers and sisters, food does not commend us to God, for if we eat, we are not better; and if we do not eat, we are not worse! However, be careful that your freedom may never become a stumbling block to the weak. For if someone sees you who have knowledge sitting in an idol's temple, will not this person's conscience, if weak, be emboldened to eat things sacrificed to idols? And thus, through your knowledge, shall the weak brother perish, for whom Christ died? And so, by sinning against the brethren and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ! Therefore, if food causes my brethren to stumble, I will never ever eat meat, so that I may not cause my brethren to stumble.

Am I not an apostle? Am I not free? Have I not seen Jesus Christ our Lord? Are you not my work in the Lord? If to others I am not an apostle, yet at least for you I am one! You are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord.

Gospel: (106) – Matthew 25:31-46

Priest: The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew.

Choir: Glory to You O Lord, Glory to You.

Priest: The Lord said: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate them one from another, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left. Then the King will tell those on his right hand, 'Come, you blessed of my Father! Inherit the Kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world! For I was hungry and you gave me food to eat; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you took me in. I was naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you visited me; I was in prison, and you came to me.'

Then the righteous will answer him, saying: 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we see you as a stranger and take you in; or naked, and clothe you? When did we see you sick, or in prison, and visit you?'

The King will answer them, 'Amen, I tell you: as much as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.' Then he will also say to those on his left hand, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire which is prepared for the devil and his angels! For I was hungry and you gave me no food; I was thirsty and you gave me no drink;

I was a stranger and you did not receive me; naked, and you did not clothe me; sick, and in prison, and you did not visit me.'

Then they will answer him: 'Lord, when did we see you hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not help you?'

Then he will answer them, saying: 'Amen, I tell you: as much as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' These ones on the left will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
